Hello families:

As we look ahead to the 2025-2026 Religious Education year, we would like to express our heartfelt gratitude to all of you for your cooperation and support. This past year, our religious education program has been a great success, thanks to the support of: you as parents to your children and to our dedicated teachers. The students are a joy to work with. The sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation were beautifully celebrated. Many of you expressed your appreciation for a very spiritually-uplifting experience. And we thank-you for your positive comments.

Planning has begun for the 2025-2026 year. This will be an exciting year for our Religious Education Program at St. Pio of Pietrelcina Parish as we previously announced, Carol Silva will be retiring at the end of July. We are deeply grateful for her faithful years of service to our parish community. Jennie Llanos will be stepping into the role of Director of Religious Education. With this transition our program will continue to grow and offer new opportunities for the children and their families to grow and deepen their faith through intentional, meaningful experiences.

Our program will continue to include several family focused components:

- •Bimonthly Children's Liturgies
- Family Events
- Student Service Projects
- •Home/Class Family Projects
- •Parent/Student Classes

This year, St. Pio's Religious Education Program will continue to include family participation. Your role as the primary educator of your child's faith will *continue* to be a powerful witness as well as give a solid spiritual foundation for not only your child(ren), but also for the entire family. At times parents will be invited to attend classes with their children so that each child can continue to build a strong, family supported faith foundation.

There are changes to the class schedules this year. The new schedule is included in this letter. Students will meet twice a month rather than having a weekly meeting session. This change in the schedule will allow families the opportunity to spend more time together and practice their faith together.

Weekly participation at Mass is an <u>expected</u> requirement of our Religious Education Program. In the midst of very busy schedules, we ask our families to commit to weekly worship. Attending Mass regularly reinforces the lessons taught in class and shows our children that faith is lived, not just learned in a classroom setting. We invite you to make the time and make the commitment to worship weekly as a family if you haven't already done so.

Please return the registration forms as soon as possible for the 2025-2026 year. This looks to be an exciting year as we reduce class-time for our students and subsequently, provide more multi-media, on-line and family-focused possibilities for mastery of the principles of our Catholic faith for each grade.

All religious education classes will be held at the St. Vincent de Paul Church campus.

- •Grades 1-6, will meet in the school
- •Grades 7, 8, 9 and 10 will meet in the lower level of the parish office building

The schedule for classes is as follows:

Grades 1 through 8 will be held twice a month

Mondays: 5:30pm to 6:30 pm Tuesdays 5:30pm to 6:30 pm

Last year, the second session offered for grades one through six had very small groups in the evening, therefore the need to have those late session on both days is not necessary.

As I would like grades 7 and 8 to meet as a whole class there will be one day offered for each of those grades. The students need to become accustomed to being together as a group to prepare them for their Confirmation classes.

Grade 7 will meet on Tuesdays from 5:30pm to 6:30 pm Grade 8 will meet on Mondays from 5:30pm to 6:30 pm

Grades 9 and 10 will meet on Monday evenings once a month from 7:00pm to 8:30pm

Payment is expected at the time of registration. We are trying to keep the fees reasonable, so we ask you to be sure to include the fee with the form. Registration Forms should be returned as soon possible thus, choice of day and time will be at a first-come basis. The deadline for registration is September 8, 2025 as classes will begin in October.

Thank you in advance for your continued support and cooperation. As a parent, you continue to accompany your child(ren) on their spiritual journey. As a parish, our future rests in the hope that families return to church, practice their faith on a weekly basis and assist their child(ren) in discovering the part that their faith plays in the larger faith community of St. Pio of Pietrelcina.



SAINT CATELL SOCIETY FOUNDED 1901 NEW HAVEN, CT

Several hundred Italian-Americans marched in a procession three blocks long in honor of St. Trofimena, a fourth century virgin martyr, whose statue was held aloft on a platform and carried through New Haven's Wooster Street neighborhood of Little Italy.

The procession, held on the saint's feast day, July 13, was sponsored by the St. Trofimena Society and was preceded by a Mass at St. Michael Church.

It included a marching band, a Knights of Columbus honor guard and representatives from the St. Catello Society and other Italian-American organizations from St. Michael and St. Anthony churches, which are part of the Blessed Michael McGivney Parish in the Elm

David Kelley, one of the organizers, said it was the first time in 40 years there has been a procession for the saint, who is patron of Minori, Italy, and the first time in 70 years for the St. Catello Society.

Kelley, who is co-president of the St. Trofimena Society with his cousin, Richard Biondi, says, "This is beyond belief. This is more than we ever anticipated or dreamed of doing." Only two years ago, the co-presidents revived the society, which was founded in 1908. It now boasts some 120 members.

"The Mass and procession mean a great deal to me and the members of the societies," Biondi says.

## **PROCESSION IN NEW HAVEN** CELEBRATES CATHOLIC FAITH, ITALIAN-AMERICAN CULTURES

"For the older members to celebrate a Mass in Italian brings back cherished memories of their youth and family members who are no longer alive."

Biondi adds that the procession was also an opportunity for unity among the Italian-American religious organizations in the New Haven area and "an occasion to celebrate our Catholic faith, as well as our Italian-American culture and traditions." The procession included delegations from societies that honor St. Trofimena, St. Catello, St. Anthony, St. Andrew, St. Anne and St. Maria Maddalena.

Father Joseph MacNeill led the procession and celebrated Mass in Italian earlier that morning. The priest, who is chaplain of St. Thomas More Chapel & Center at Yale in New Haven, traces his ancestry on his mother's side to the Abruzzi region of Italy.

"I'm here to continue to give witness to our passion, faith, culture and saints for the next generation of Italian Americans," he says. Founded in 1901, members of the St. Catello Society carried a statue of the ninth century bishop of Castellamare di Stabia, a city southeast of Naples.

Gene Avino, whose grandfather began the society to help immigrants from his home, says the group will celebrate its 125th anniversary next year.

The president, Paul Criscuolo, says there has been a renewed interest in Italian heritage and that 14 new members have enrolled, some of them from Ireland, Italy, California and Florida. Around the turn of the century, immigrants established Italian societies at St. Michael's, the oldest Italian church in Connecticut, to offer assistance to one another, honor their traditions and share their devotion to the patron saints of their hometowns.

According to tradition, St. Trofimena was a young woman who was killed by her father for refusing to marry a pagan because she was Christian.

Kelley said the day was a testament to the enduring presence of Italian-American culture and faith.

"I grew up at St. Michael's Church as a child and spent a lot of time with my grandparents," he recalled. "I love our Italian traditions, so we hope this is a kind of revival."
