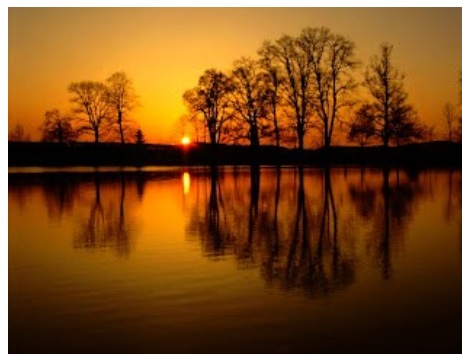

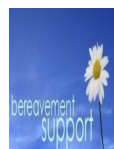

Pastor's
Desk*



In recent times, the Church has granted permission for the lay faithful to receive Holy Communion under both species, that is to say that they may receive from the Chalice **AFTER** receiving the Sacred Host. This was a more widespread practice before Covid. I would like to revive this practice at St. Pio of Pietrelcina Parish on Sundays during the major seasons of Lent, Easter, Advent and Christmas. This will be available at all Sunday Masses, including the Saturday vigil Masses, starting the weekend of February 21st and 22nd . There will be the same number of Ministers of Holy Communion at Mass as there are currently (four). However, Holy Communion will not be distributed at the break half way down the aisle. Rather, the Priest and Deacon (or Extraordinary Minister) will distribute the Hosts at the center aisle. Then those choosing not to receive from the Chalice will proceed to the side aisles to return to their pews. Those electing to receive from the Chalice will approach the Minister at one corner, by the side aisle. After receiving from the Chalice, the communicant will then return to his or her pew by the side aisle. Rest assured that the ministers will wipe the rim of the chalice after each communicant receives the Precious Blood. Experience has shown that there is very little transmission of germs through this method. I hope you will find this practice beneficial to your spiritual life.

The Combined Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion



Catechumen: Adult seeking Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

Candidate: Adult seeking the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist.

Confirmandi: Adult seeking Confirmation only.

OCIA The Rite of Election: At this rite, upon the testimony of sponsors and catechists and the catechumens' affirmation of their intention to join the Church, the Church makes its "election" of these catechumens to receive the Sacraments of Initiation. In the presence of the bishop, they inscribe their names in the Book of the Elect at the cathedral a pledge of fidelity. Now the catechumens are called "the elect" or "the illuminandi." They now begin a Period of Purification and Enlightenment.



The Call to Continuing Conversion: is a significant liturgical event in the Catholic Church that marks the transition of candidates preparing for the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist, recognizing their readiness and commitment to continue their Christian journey.



The Rite of Sending: This Sunday at the 10:30 Mass, we will celebrate the Rite of Sending our Catechumens and Candidates off to Archbishop Coyne for the Combined Rite. This is an opportunity to recognize God's work in the lives of the Catechumens and Candidates, to formally declare that they are ready to be presented to the bishop for the Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion.

As winter lingers and Lent approaches, Sacred Heart Parish in Suffield is once again inviting parishioners to gather for a joyful celebration that brings the community together before the reflective season begins. On Feb. 15, following the 10:30 a.m. Mass, parishioners are encouraged to head to the church hall for the second annual Mardi Gras celebration—a lively afternoon of food, music and fellowship.

Mardi Gras celebrations, especially those rooted in New Orleans tradition, are an institution in themselves, culminating with Fat Tuesday, the day before Ash Wednesday on Feb. 18. At Sacred Heart, the spirit of Mardi Gras is embraced not simply as a party, but as a meaningful pause before the Church enters Lent—a season centered on prayer, fasting and almsgiving in preparation for Easter.

Last year's inaugural event drew between 80 and 100 people, ranging from senior citizens to young families with children, and organizers say the response was overwhelmingly positive.

"I work with a gal who goes to a church in Hartford and one Lent the priest had a Mass on Mardi Gras night and asked people to bring what they were giving up for Lent," Jeanne Forschino, who heads the Sacred Heart Social Committee, explains. "I thought that was a great idea and just think of how this would impact children at the Mass, to visibly see their parents centering

something and themselves bringing something as well."

Forschino adds attendance is strongest when activities are held immediately after weekend Mass and paired with food, which led the committee to plan a lunch following the final Sunday Mass. After limited participation in a written Lenten intentions book last year, the group will instead invite parishioners to place name tags with Lenten promises into a basket for the altar. This year's celebration will feature a catered meal (tickets are \$15 per adult and \$5 per child) to help cover costs. Tables will include information about Lenten devotions, offering attendees a transition from celebration to reflection.

Forschino notes barbecue food will be served, including pulled pork, smoked chicken, macaroni and cheese (a gluten free option will be available), green beans with almonds, rice and beans, and chicken tenders.

Music will fill the hall thanks to Paul Kulas, a beloved parishioner in his mid-90s who plays saxophone and clarinet, adding warmth and nostalgia to the afternoon. Children will also enjoy activities such as

making Mardi Gras masks and coloring beads to take home.

The event follows a tradition Sacred Heart has been building in recent years: creating opportunities for parishioners to gather beyond Sunday Mass. From barn dances hosted by

parish families to themed dinners for Valentine's Day and St. Patrick's Day, these events have helped strengthen parish life. Mardi Gras, however, has captured something special.

For Father Joseph Keough, pastor of Sacred Heart Parish, the event will be a "fun-raiser" and he credits Forschino's dedication and perseverance.

"Jeanne is a very determined person and she's done a fantastic job with it," he adds.
